Ioannis Arapoglou


Chairman of the Board, GASTRADE S.A., Copelouzos Group

Ioannis K. Chatjigeorgiou, Professor National Technical University of Athens



Ioannis K. Chatjigeorgiou is a Professor in the School of Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering of the National Technical University of Athens, Greece. He is currently the Director of the Section of Marine Structures. He has been a Visiting Professor at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology, Norway; École Centrale de Marseille, France; and the University of East Anglia, UK. He was awarded the Marie Curie Fellowship for outstanding researchers. His research involves analytical hydrodynamics, hydroelasticity,

hydrodynamic violent slamming and dynamics of risers and mooring systems. He is a member of several professional societies, a member of the editorial board of Applied Ocean Research, and associate editor of the Journal of Offshore Mechanics and Arctic Engineering. He has authored two books and has published nearly 150 papers or chapters in refereed journals, conference proceedings, and edited books.

George Dimopoulos

Principal Specialist in DNVGL and Manager of the Maritime R&D



George Dimopoulos is a Principal Specialist in DNVGL and Manager of the Maritime R&D and Advisory unit in Piraeus, Greece. His field of expertise is the modelling and optimization of complex ship machinery systems in all ship segments, including Gas carriers, LNG carriers and FSRUs; with aim to improve the overall competitiveness of maritime assets. He is lead researcher or project manager in various R&D, ship concept design and advisory projects working closely with major international ship owners, yards and manufacturers. Most notably, George has worked in the concept design and bidding support for major LNG / Gas carrier projects and tenders assisting owners to improve the competitiveness of their NB designs. He has also worked closely with operators on several projects on the energy efficiency, performance improvement and troubleshooting of ship machinery systems. He also serves as an expert in assisting shipping companies to map their energy performance needs and improve their monitoring and analytics systematics. George and his team aim at fusing forefront research methods and computer modelling techniques to optimize ship systems for improved performance, safety, fuel savings, emissions reductions and cost-effectiveness, in practice. He holds a PhD. in Marine Engineering and a Diploma in Naval Architecture and Marine Engineering both from National Technical University of Athens, Greece. George has authored more than 35 peer-reviewed papers in scientific conferences and journals.

Since 2004 Mr. Papanicolaou has been employed as an economic adviser in Greece and abroad. He has also served as Chairman, Deputy Chairman or member of the Board of Directors of several companies

From 1998 to 2004, Mr. Papanicolaou was the Director General of the International Center for Black Sea Studies and from 1997 to 2005 he was the Alternate Governor of Greece at the Black Sea Trade and Development Bank.

Prior to that, Mr. Papanicolaou had a career in government where he served, among other positions, as Chief Economic Advisor to the Prime Minister of Greece, Chairman of the Council of Economic Advisors to the Ministry of National Economy and Special Advisor to the Minister of Foreign Affairs on issues of economic diplomacy and external economic relations.

He started his professional career as a Lecturer in Economics at the London School of Economics and at the Queen Mary College (London University). Mr. Papanicolaou has studied economics at the National University of Athens (1ST class Honors Degree in Economics), the London School of Economics (M.Sc.Econ with Distinction) and the London Graduate School for Business Studies (Senior Executive Program).

Gus Papamichalopoulos

Vice President, IENE/Partner, KG Law Firm



Gus heads the Energy, Infrastructure and Utilities Practice Group. His main area of expertise is on the energy industry and he has been involved in the liberalization of the Greek electricity market and gas market. Due to the complexity of the issues associated with the electricity market regulations he advises on major regulatory issues of the electricity, natural gas and RES market.

As a business lawyer focusing on the energy sector, key international energy companies investing in Greece have mandated Gus in the early stages of their investment program for the implementation of important energy projects (infrastructure projects such as oil and gas investments, the licensing and development of gas pipelines, the establishment of power generation plants, wind parks, low pressure gas distribution networks, etc). Another element of his practice is the public sector-privatization projects, in which he has acted for both the Greek State and the private sector (e.g. privatization of State-owned companies, concession agreements, public private partnerships relating to parking stations, toll roads, etc). Project finance is a strong section of his practice, since major local financial and credit institutions and private equity funds are instructing the team for the financing of energy infrastructure projects. Gus also serves as one of the managing partners of KG Law Firm, has acted as co-chair of SEE LEGAL Group for

two years and currently serves as Deputy Chairman of the Institute of Energy of South East Europe (IENE).
