

TurkStream: Onwards from Ipsala/Kipoi?



"We have installed available capacity ready to produce more than 100 bcm of gas today, so we don't need any additional investment to produce more than 100 bcm. 





In reference case, it is anticipated that Western Europe will continue to heavily depend on Russian natural gas through to 2050.



East Med & Regional Gas Pipelines Source: DEPA




East Med Pipeline (water depths)


